The Alexander von Humboldt Foundation will grant again one of the best endowed research awards in Germany. Applications can be submitted by outstanding young post-doctoral scientists and scholars from abroad and of all disciplines. Applicants should be no more than 35 years of age.

The funding of up to a total of EUR 1.2 million for each award enables its winners to conduct their own research work, to finance a workgroup at a German university or non-university research institution, and to cover their own living expenses over a period of four years.
